

HAPPY BIRTHDAY YOUR MAJESTY

In 2012 Billericay honoured Her Majesty by dedicating the field at Sun Corner to be a Queen Elizabeth II Field, and installed a wonderful beacon there. By dedicating Sun Corner as a QEII Field its use as an open space for the people of Billericay has been protected for perpetuity. This year sees Her Majesty's 90th birthday, and Billericay will honour her in special ways again.



First, on Saturday 5th March, we will participate in the nationwide "Clean for the Queen" campaign to spruce up the town. The Litter Pick will focus on the town centre and nearby areas, including of course, Sun Corner. If you want to join in meet at the Town Council Offices in Crown Yard at 9am. Special "Clean for the Queen" rubbish sacks, litter pickers and all other essential equipment will be provided. Contact the Town Clerk to let her know you are coming.

Then, on Thursday 21st April, which is Her Majesty's birthday, a special event will take place at Sun Corner at around 8pm, when our beacon will be lit. It will be one of hundreds of beacons being lit that evening across the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories, and Her Majesty herself will light the Principle Beacon.

CIVIC SERVICE

Billericay Town Council will be holding its annual civic service on Sunday 13th March at 3pm. This year the theme for the event will be "Never On Your Own" so we can focus on loneliness in the community and bring together all the community groups that try to alleviate it.

It will be attended by the Chairman of Essex County Council, Cllr Norman Hume as well as our own County Councillor Kay Twitchen.

BILLERICAY TOWN AND THE BASILDON BOROUGH LOCAL PLAN

The Basildon Local Plan 2016 says that altogether the Borough needs 15,260 new homes to meet housing needs over the next 20 years. This is about a 20% increase. Billericay Town has been allocated 1380 (an 11% increase). Previously developed land will be used wherever possible, but because there is little urban or brownfield land available for building in Billericay, nearly all the new homes will be built on Green Belt sites. The public consultation on the Draft Local Plan, which can be viewed online at <http://basildon.objective.co.uk/portal>, commenced on 28 January and runs until 24 March. Copies of the document can be viewed at Council Offices and in local libraries during normal opening hours. There is also a series of public meetings

at which the Draft Local Plan can be discussed; the programme for these meetings can be viewed online at www.basildon.gov.uk/planningpolicy.

The easiest way to comment is online at <http://basildon.objective.co.uk/portal>, or comments can be submitted by email to planningpolicy@basildon.gov.uk or by post to Planning Policy at The Basildon Centre, St Martin's Square, Basildon SS14 1DL.

The Town Council is preparing a response to the consultation and urges residents to submit individual replies to Basildon Council. If you disagree with the proposals individual comments are more effective than petitions or joint objections.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY AND THE WAR MEMORIAL



Remembrance Sunday took place on Sunday, November 8th 2015. This is always spearheaded by the British Legion together with Churches Together and other Billericay groups and societies. This year the normal plans were thrown into a state of confusion when the police announced they would no longer be providing traffic management as they had done in previous years. As in many areas the British Legion numbers are

diminishing and so they came to the Town Council for help in managing this difficulty. The Council immediately stepped in to

arrange for a road closure and the event was able to take place without mishap. The closure was financed by the Town Council with contributions from Co-operative Funeralcare and the Billericay Society.

As always it was a most memorable parade and service with representatives from Billericay Churches, groups, clubs, societies and Town and Youth Town Councillors laying wreaths as well as some individuals. It was most rewarding this year because as a result of the road closure people were able to linger and chat and reflect around the memorial for longer than in previous years.

The Memorial itself is cared for by the Town Council and it is very important to us to keep it looking its best. To this end it is regularly tended and kept clean and tidy by Councillors. It is a prominent feature on the corner of Chapel Street and next to St. Mary Magdalen and important to us that it is well kept.

Last year's weather patterns were so strange with plants not necessarily doing what they should when they should and we found that the begonias were still looking a picture in October. So prior to Remembrance Sunday we agonised over whether to keep these flowers but run the risk they might be frost damaged by the Sunday or should we replace them with the problem they might not be at their best when they were needed. We took the decision to replant and have been suitably rewarded because the polyanthus looked a picture and they are still looking good especially now at this dull time of the year.

BILLERICAY TOWN COUNCIL CELEBRATION OF XMAS LIGHTS

Billericay Town Council has been organising the switch on of the Christmas Lights for many years but ventured into pastures new putting on an afternoon of entertainment provided by local schools and community groups. The weather was kind with just a brief shower early afternoon and The Chequers provided a Christmas feel with snow falling, mulled wine, hot chocolate and some characters from Frozen.

We were entertained by the Mayflower Morris Men and the Wickford Majorettes announced by our Town Crier in the High Street. The focus was then directed to the stage with High Voltage Big Band playing a medley of Christmas songs. They played at intervals throughout the afternoon. 

A MAGICAL TRANSFORMATION TO CELEBRATE CHILDREN

The gardens surrounding the Child in the Park Statue in Lake Meadows Park are to be magically transformed thanks to a grant of over £6,000 from the Veolia North Thames Trust (VNTT), which was applied for by the Town Council working in partnership with the Friends of Lake Meadows.

New paths will be created around the statue and the area will be brought to life by the wonderful colours of the new plants that are to be planted by the volunteers that regularly look after the garden.

Doug Benjafield – Chairman VNTT said *"This is such a lovely project and will help bring to life the Child in the Park Statue at the same time as making it more accessible to visitors young and old"*.

DOWN WITH UNAUTHORISED BANNERS

The Town Council takes the issue of unauthorised banners seriously and is addressing residents' concerns. Banners can be a blight on the town especially in the Conservation Area and entry points to the town. The railings around the Jim Shields garden, at the junction of Western Road and the High Street, are a particular example of an area where banners cause a blemish. Working with Basildon Borough Council, Essex County Council and Abellio Greater Anglia Rail the Town Council will take down banners. Where possible advertisers will be advised that banners will be stored at the Town Council offices for a reasonable time before their disposal. With this policy in place residents will see less unsightly banners around the town.

LOCAL ELECTIONS 2016

All the Councillors on Billericay Town Council are elected every four years and on 5th May this year there will be an election to fill the 20 seats on the Council.

The Notice of election will be published on 30th March and nominations have to be received by Electoral Services at Basildon Borough Council by 4pm on Thursday 7th April.

PINK RECYCLING SACKS

The Town Council will no longer be distributing pink recycling sacks from their office in Crown Yard. Town Councillors agreed it was too much of a disruption to the work in the office and decided to withdraw the service. Basildon Council will continue to deliver a twice yearly supply of sacks to each property in Billericay and additional rolls can always be obtained from Billericay Library when residents need them. The Town Council will still sell the food and green waste recycling bags and these are available from the Town Council office during our opening hours Monday to Friday 9.30-12.30. Prices: £1.90 per roll of green recycling bags, and £3.00 for 50 food waste recycling bags.

PRECEPT HELD FOR 7TH YEAR RUNNING

Billericay Town Council is delighted to announce that at the Town Council meeting held on 10th December 2015, members voted unanimously to keep the precept for Billericay residents the same as last year.

Focus on Local Charities



This edition's featured charity is the Billericay and South Essex link of the Chernobyl Children's Lifeline.

For the last two years my family has hosted two children from the Chernobyl region for four weeks over the summer, as part of a recuperative holiday organised by the Chernobyl Children's Lifeline.

The charity is now looking for new potential host families in Billericay who might be able to offer a home to either two girls or two boys, aged 10 – 12, for four weeks from Sunday 12th June to Sunday 10th July 2016. This is such a rewarding experience, knowing you are making a huge difference to the lives of these children who are still living with the adverse health and economic legacy of the Chernobyl nuclear disaster 30 years ago. The children are taken on outings every day during the week; you would need to look after them evenings and weekends. You will need a spare room, and preferably to be within easy reach of the Methodist Church on Western Road, where the children need to be dropped at 9 every day and picked up at 4:30. However, all the other local host families are so supportive that if there are any logistical problems someone can usually help out.

OLD BILLERICAY

GREAT BURSTEAD PRIMARY SCHOOL was housed in the building now know as The Fold and part of Reids bar and restaurant.

The school was opened on 10th September 1878 by the Great Burstead School Board to provide primary education for the children of Billericay and surrounding areas between 5 and 13 years of age. It operated on the same site until it moved to the present site where it became two separate entities, infant and junior. When did it change the name to Quilters. Do you know?

The original site had a number of alterations during it's life as a school, mainly the front extensions towards the road, built between the wars, and a dining room and kitchens to the rear in 1948 and a wooden three classroom block in 1951, also at the rear. The building closed and boarded up after the new school was built and it was not until The Fold moved from what is now the Waitrose car park did new life come to the building. The northern part of the building was turned into a bar/restaurant and the buildings to the rear were knocked down to form the car park and housing land.

The proposed sites for the 1380 houses are:

- 150 homes north of Potash Road**
- 280 homes west of Mountnessing Road**
- 180 homes south of London Road**
- 160 homes west of Tye Common Road**
- 280 homes east of Greens Farm Lane**
- 330 homes east of Frithwood Lane**

The review attempts to ensure that the purpose of the wider Green Belt is maintained, and that those parts of the Green Belt of higher landscape and/or ecological value are protected where possible.

Criteria have been developed for each allocation, setting out the types of development which may occur, with an Infrastructure Delivery Plan to support the new homes and any mitigation necessary. A number of road improvements are detailed, including a "southern relief road" from the junction of Noak Hill Road and Laindon Road, to London Road west of Mountnessing Road.

Associated topics addressed in the plan include education, health services, locations for employment, transport, town centre regeneration and expansion, open spaces, sports provision and community facilities, and local wildlife sites.
