wonderful prizegiving evening when Ken Crowther of BBC Essex came to present the prizes to the delighted winners in the 10 categories which were available this


year. Young and old were again present to make this one of the most enjoyable events in the Town Council's calendar.

For two years the Town Council has been trying, as part of its efforts to improve facilities in our town, to install a public convenience near the High Street. Having finally flushed our way through all the legalities associated with acquiring and siting a toilet, the Town Council is pleased to announce that a contract has been signed with Healthmatic and Basildon District Council to provide a public convenience in the Basildon District Council car park behind Woolworths. The toilet will comply with the Disability Discrimination Act and offer baby change facilities. It will be cleaned automatically but

will also be checked daily by an employee. Connections to the utilities - water, sewage,

electricity and telephone – will take several months but we have been told the facility will be available early in the New Year.

We apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused during the installation of the convenience but we hope Billericay people and visitors will appreciate the new facility.
