AFTER THE FIRST World War towns and villages all over the country expressed a desire to mark the fallen in some way. By 1920 this had reached a peak and in October of that year it was suggested that in Billericay the Memorial should take the form of a cross to be erected in the small enclosure adjoining the Church. By February of 1921 it was decided that a Public War Memorial Committee would be charged with the funding and erection of the memorial. Work to design and install the memorial was quick and it was ready in plenty of time before the third anniversary of the armistice.

On Sunday 16th October 1921 at 3 p.m. The War Memorial was unveiled by Major General Sir William Thwaites and Rev. S. L. Brown, the Rural Dean and Rector of Fryerning Parish Church, conducted the dedication Service. There was a guard of honour of 40 ex-servicemen under Regimental Sgt. Major J. W. Wheatley surrounding the Memorial.

On Saturday 16th October 2021at 3 p.m. to celebrate the Centenary of this event a service was held in St Mary Magdalen in the High Street. This service conducted by Rev. Paul Carr followed the original order of service. At the end of the service in the church the whole congregation gathered around the War Memorial for the Commemoration and two minutes silence after the playing of the Last Post. Wreaths were then laid by Cllr. David Dadds, Mayor of Basildon, Cllr. Jim Devlin, Chairman of Billericay Town Council, and Brian Hughes, President of the Billericay Branch of the Royal British Legion; other wreaths and tributes were laid by members of families of the fallen.

The method by which the names appear on the Memorial is lost, but in common with the processes elsewhere it was probably up to relatives to put forward names of loved ones to the Committee. This explains why some names appear on more than one War Memorial in the area and that some of the men were not residents of Billericay before the war. In total there are 62 men remembered on the Billericay First World War Memorial including three pairs of brothers and a pair of cousins.

The War Memorial is a Grade II listed structure and the Town Council is the custodian.

MAYFLOWER 400 STATUE PROJECT

IN 2020 THE Town Council commissioned an artwork by the sculptor John Doubleday to commemorate the 400th anniversary of the Mayflower sailing. The artwork was installed in Jim Shields Garden at the bottom of the High Street in November. There was much praise for the project, but residents and councillors felt it would be great if the Mayflower could be visible around the clock, so the

Town Council decided to install a spotlight to illuminate this amazing piece of artwork at night.

We are pleased to announce that the project is now finished and the spotlight has been installed. We would like to thank Bennetts Funeral Directors who made a financial contribution towards the installation of the light which has greatly enhanced this fantastic piece of art in the Town.

OPEN FOR BUSINESS: THE FIRST 4 MONTHS AT THE CHANTRY CENTRE

THE TOWN COUNCIL moved to its new Chantry Centre premises on 31st December last year, but it was 5 months before Covid restrictions were relaxed enough to allow us to start taking bookings.

Rising steadily from

an initial 10 hours in May, September has seen the facility host over 270 hours of activities for local residents. We are seeing increasing volumes of bookings, not only from commercial organisations (such as fitness classes and pop-up shops), but also from community groups as they begin once again to meet in person. By the end of September approximately 40% of the facility's use was by local volunteer-based groups. Financially, we are ahead of our budgeted income projection for the first year.

A wide range of activities are being delivered including those targeting social support, youth activities, entertainment, and those associated with general health & wellbeing and fitness.

The Town Council are especially pleased by the number of community activities focusing on tackling social isolation, a problem which increased significantly during lockdown. These include the Good Companions Club, a "Bump and Baby" coffee morning for new parents and a Sunday Matinee film show. During the summer holidays Active Essex delivered sessions for young people funded by Essex County Council, and groups including the Horticultural Society, Photofold Camera Club and the Gone Too Soon Bereavement Support group have become regular users.

Available for hire are 4 rooms which can take between 12 and 60

people. All are configurable depending on whether you are planning a lecture, a round table discussion or simply need the floor clear for an activity. We also have a large hall with full audio-visual equipment and screen and flexible format staging.

Charging is based on two rates. The Community Rate is for volunteer/not-for-profit/community groups and rooms are available for between £10 and £15 per hour, whilst the hall is £20/hour. The Commercial Rate is for businesses and private hires with rooms available at £25 to £30/hour and the hall at £40/hour. A fully





equipped kitchen is also available. Full details for booking can be found on the Town Council's website;

BILLERICAY FIRED-UP FOR THE PLATINUM JUBILEE

IN CELEBRATION OF the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, we can all look forward to an extended bank holiday from Thursday 2nd June to Sunday 5th June 2022. This will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate the historic milestone. The 4 days of celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well

as national moments of reflection on the Queens 70 years of service.

The UK's long tradition of celebrating Royal occasions with the lighting of beacons will be continued to mark the Platinum Jubilee. Beacons will be lit throughout the UK and Commonwealth, including Billericay's own Beacon at Sun Corner. The Billericay Beacon will be ignited shortly after 9pm on Thursday 2nd June 2022 as the climax of a celebratory event currently being planned by the Town Council.

Billericay will thus play its part in what promises to be an historic, moving, and enjoyable occasion. More details to follow but residents are encouraged to put the date in their 2022 diaries!

GRANTS

EACH YEAR THE Town Council allocates funds to support worthy projects by local community groups and September saw 3 grant applications approved. A total of £1,200 was split between the Billericay Parkrun (towards the cost of a new defibrillator), the Friends of Lake Meadows (to add new plants to the Rhododendron Garden whose construction the Town Council originally supported in 2015) and finally, to the Billericay Men's Shed. This is a new group who are converting a hut in Lake Meadows to create a place

can pursue practical skills, share knowledge, and develop social connections. Men's Sheds help reduce Ioneliness and isolation but most importantly they're fun. The group will become involved in community projects providing services such as repair, restoration, or construction.



Consultation on Future of the Automated Public Convenience

In 2007, following consultation with residents, the Town Council entered into a 15 year contract with Healthmatic PLC to provide an automated public facility (APC) which would be available to anyone visiting the High Street 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The toilet costs just under £20,000 p.a. to operate and the public are charged 20p per visit. The cost includes maintenance, servicing, cleaning, electricity and rental of the unit and the spaces it occupies in the car park. The contract is expiring in 2022 and therefore the Town Council is now seeking to consult with residents again before deciding what action to take. We ask that people completing the survey live within the boundary of Billericay. This is due to Question 7 and a possible increase in the precept.
