The Notice of election will be published at the end of March and nominations have to be completed and delivered to Electoral Services at Basildon Borough Council at the start of April. The relevant dates will be made available on the Town Council's website as soon as they become available.

TOWN COUNCIL WORKS TO SAVE HIGH STREET POST OFFICE



® THE TOWN COUNCIL recognises the High Street post office is an essential resource for residents and was concerned when One Stop gave 12 months notice to the Post Office that the High Street store will be closing in November this year. Our local MP John Baron secured a meeting with the Post Office

together with our Vice Chairman, Cllr. Jim Devlin and representatives from Basildon Council to look at ways of retaining this service within the High Street. The Post Office have advertised the availability of the Post Office business and further work by this group is ongoing.

APPEAL DISMISSED – POTASH ROAD DEVELOPMENT – A WIN FOR BILLERICAY AND RESIDENTS

AN OUTLINE PLANNING application for 150 dwellings and a 50 bed care home that were to be built in the land between and behind numbers 41 and 65 Potash Road, had been objected to by Billericay Town Council and refused by Basildon Borough Council.

This resulted in an appeal against the decision being raised by P & A Investments Limited and P D Developments (Essex) Limited. The appeal was heard by Jonathan Price, of the Planning Inspectorate, on the 12th-14th December 2023.

On day one of the appeal, open for public participation, Cllr James Tutton, (Billericay Town Council — Planning Committee Chairman), and 3 members of the public, Mr Alasdair Daw (Billericay Action Group), Ms Samantha Ruston (Potash Road Action Group) and Mr Gordon Taylor, attended the full session.

All presented their objections to the plans in a exemplary, detailed, knowledgeable and passionate manner which was positively noted by the Planning Inspector. An excellent presentation was also given by ClIr Andrew Schrader (Basildon Borough Council – Billericay East) supporting the call for the appeal to fail.

The main appeal process continued for 2 more days. The Inspector viewed the area concerned, on the last day of the appeal proceedings.

The appeal had failed – it was dismissed. This satisfying result was announced on the 23rd January 2024.

This is a great result for the residents of and around Potash Road and Billericay. It proves that when a sound case is properly supported and presented, residents are able to win against the large building corporations.



NEW FACE ON THE TOWN COUNCIL

AT THE COUNCIL meeting held on 14th December last year members voted to co-opt Jessica Leung to the vacant seat in West Ward.

Jessica moved to Billericay from Hong Kong almost two years ago and comfortably calls Billericay home and says she is devoted to contributing her best efforts to this lovely town.

As well as serving the residents of Billericay she is also a Wavemaker campaigning for gender equality at Billericay Town Football Club and a fundraiser for the Billericay Foodbank.



KING CHARLES III OFFICIAL PORTRAIT

THE FREE TREE GIVEAWAY EVENT BY THE BILLERICAY TREE WARDENS

ON SATURDAY 25TH November from 10am to

3pm, volunteers from Billericay Tree Wardens were outside Paul Robinson's the solicitors in the High Street giving away 55 two-foot-high trees and advice on their planting and care. "Black Friday" had been followed by a "Green Saturday"! A very successful event with strong engagement from shoppers and visitors to the High Street.

The locally grown native tree species on offer were Rowan, Cherry, Hazel, Silver Birch, and Oak. Some

'mini-whips' (very small trees!) were eagerly sought after by the children of the parents passing by, thus ensuring the enthusiasm of the young folk, one of the remits of the Billericay Tree Wardens. It's not often that the Billericay Tree Wardens gets to meet the public as often their work is behind the scenes liaising with Residents and the Local Authority on tree issues. A big thank you to Paul Robinson's for allowing use of their frontage for this event.

Billericay Town Council have had positive feedback via emails and social media by those who received and have already planted the trees in their gardens! Accordingly, Billericay Tree Wardens plan to repeat this event on an annual basis. The Billericay Tree Wardens is a subgroup of the Billericay Town Council.

TREE PLANTING AT BLACK CAT MEADOW BY THE BILLERICAY TREE WARDENS

ON SATURDAY 9TH December the Billericay Tree Wardens and friends planted seventy trees in 'Black Cat Meadow' which is just south of Norsey Wood and the railway line. Planted were fine young specimens of the following native tree species, Oak, Willow, Silver Birch, Rowan, Elder, Hazel, Hawthorn and Blackthorn.

Cllr Chris May, on the left, himself a Tree Warden, participated in the event.

If ever one needs confirmation that Billericay is mainly built on thick clay soil, then this is the proof! Several residents living nearby expressed an interest in the project and are keen to be our "ears & eyes" as to the safety of the trees. Unfortunately, vandalism to trees in the town continues, so having observers next to the site is a safeguard. The Meadow is the resident's recreation area, so the planting has been kept to the periphery. A small project but every little helps in the face of the global Climate Crisis. The Billericay Tree Wardens is a subgroup of the Billericay Town Council.
