ANNUAL REPORT 2008/2009

am pleased to introduce the Billericay Town Council Annual Report for the Municipal financial year 2008/2009. It contains details of our activities in the current year and our plans for 2009/2010.

We were a newly elected Council in May 2008 for a four year tenure and although a number of Councillors changed we have continued to be a strong and effective group doing what we can to improve the town for all residents. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those members who stood down, including Captain Beverley Beale our past Chairman, for all the good work they did on behalf of the Town Council when they held office.

This current fiscal year has seen steady progress made by the Town Council and the main highlights are:

- ➤ No increase in the precept over the previous year;
- ▶ 261 planning applications reviewed;
- Delivered Teen Play area in Lake Meadows;
- ► Successful Billericay in Bloom Competition;
- ▶ 'Big Litter Pick";
- Switching-on ceremony of the new Christmas Lights;
- Stakeholders in the Billericay Health Steering Group Review;
- ▶ BBC Radio 4 "Any Questions" held in Billericay;
- Billericay Walk signage and a new Circular Walks brochure;
- Application for Town Green status being pursued;
- New Billericay Youth Town Council.

The precept for 2008/2009 was set with a nil increase over the previous year. The Finance Committee have been very prudent in managing our financial business including taking action to avoid risk in the banking system. So far we have avoided difficulties. We continue to seek outside funding to support our projects and this year has

seen much success in securing funds.

The Christmas Lights were completely changed this year with the introduction of a new contractor and we received a number of compliments from the local residents which were very welcome. We thank all those organisations and retailers who made donations and shared in its success.

The best dressed Christmas shop window was won by Thermaseal for its very seasonal theme; they donated their cheque prize to the local charity HamelinTrust.

The newly elected Billericay Youth Town Council members convened their first meeting in October and are proving to be a very energetic group. We welcome their new ideas and activities going forward.

In January we were pleased to deliver the new Teen Play Equipment into Lake Meadows and we thank Basildon District Council for their total cooperation throughout this project and for the land to build the play area. We are also grateful to the Billericay Youth Town Council for all their energy and ideas with regard to this project.

With the help of Billericay Society, we produced a Billericay Circular Walks brochure to help you get out and enjoy finding your way around our town

Looking forward, we are very aware of the credit crunch and its impact on each household and we will do everything possible to keep costs down but at the same time keep delivering good value and coming up with new ideas for the future.

We are actively seeking to retain Sun Corner as a Town Green in perpetuity. An application has been submitted to Essex County Council and we hope to have a successful outcome early in the new fiscal year.

We continue to work closely and in partnership with Basildon District Council and other organisations to enhance areas within the Town. Lake Meadows is of special interest to us and with the Katherine Jenkins concert scheduled for July this will raise the profile of the town enormously.

We continue to support The Billericay Design Statement Association as it continues with its

FINANCIAL REPORT APRIL 2008 TO MARCH 2009

The Finance & General Purposes Committee's primary task is to make best use of Billericay taxpayers' money by obtaining maximum value and providing optimum service at the lowest possible cost to Billericay residents. The precept [Billericay Town Council Tax] for 2008/2009 was set at £17.37 for a Band D property, the same as for the previous year. Inspite of this nil tax increase all planned projects and actions have been fully funded and the required prudent operational reserves secured. In the light of the general banking crisis during 2008, and because the Town Council's cash deposits are not protected by the Government, we divided our cash reserves [deposit accounts] between three Banks thus minimising the risk of any potential loss due to default. Following the series of drastic reductions in interest rates by the Bank of England, all savers, including your Town Council, faced reduced interest income from deposits. Nevertheless, we still earned £11,000 bank interest compared with £18,000 in the previous year. Due to a large extent to the efforts of our Town Clerk we received £75,000 outside funding towards the cost of our projects.



PLANS FOR 2009/2010

Recognising the downturn in the general economic situation affecting everybody in Billericay, the Town Council has decided to set the 2009/2010 precept for a Band D property at £16.20, a reduction of 6.7% compared with 2008/2009.



WORKING PARTIES

The F&GPC has supervisory responsibilities for a number of Working Parties and for the Billericay Youth Town Council.

The Town Crier Working Party chaired by Cllr. Marion Wilson is responsible for the Town Crier which provides news of what the Town Council and Youth Town Council are doing and, where there is space information about other local organisations.

The Town Guide Working Party chaired by Cllr. Marion Wilson. Members of the Working Party have already started preparing the next edition of the Town Guide which will be launched on 30th October 2009.

The IT [Information Technology] Working Party chaired by Cllr. David Knight. The website (www.billericaytowncouncil.gov.uk) continued to be developed and maintained to reflect new and changing information. The IT infrastructure has been updated to cater for new products and for essential safeguards' such as anti-virus software and the Disaster Plan. The new Omega Financial Package was purchased and implemented successfully and ran parallel with the existing system during the fourth quarter of the municipal year 2008-2009 to enable full running for the new financial year.

The Noticeboard Working Party chaired by Cllr. Peter Bowditch instigated the installation of a new sponsored noticeboard at the High Street/Western Road junction.

The **Youth Town Council Working Party** chaired by Cllr. Colin Dyer. The main task of this

group is to monitor and advise the members of the Billericay Youth Town Council. The Youth Council consists of 20 elected young people who live or attend schools within Billericay. During the course of the year we have contacted the various youth organisations and clubs within the town with a view to setting up a Youth Facility Register.

PLANNING COMMITTEE

Chairman: Cllr. John Buchanan

It is the role of the Council's Planning Committee to look at every planning application, and every highways related proposal affecting Billericay, and to respond appropriately to Basildon District Council, as the planning authority, or Essex County Council, as the highways authority. The Committee met every two weeks in order to keep up with the work and to ensure that our views are sent to the relevant authority to meet their deadlines. On average, the Committee dealt with 10 planning applications at every meeting.



The Pedestrian & Cycle Routes Working Party chaired by Cllr. John Buchanan. Following the erection of signs on the routes from Greens Farm Lane to Sun Corner and the Railway Station to Queens Park Country Park, approval was received for signs on the routes from the High Street to Perry Street, and from Greens Farm Lane to the Railway Station. Three new projects were commenced during the year:

- a leaflet with a map of the circular walks previously only available as a booklet without a map (available from the Town Council Office);
- programme of town trail guided walks for tourists which will take place in the summer;
- ▶ a leaflet of 'Healthy Shortcuts in Billericay'.

The Sun Corner Project Group chaired by Cllr John Buchanan. We have continued to obtain evidence to support our application for Sun Corner to be formally registered as a Town Green.

ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE Chairman: Cllr. David Knight

REPORT FOR THE YEAR APRIL 2008 TO MARCH 2009

The Environment Committee's main responsibility is to provide the focal point for the initiation, support, financial control and completion of all environmental projects that will help to provide additional facilities and, hopefully, an improved quality of life for our residents. I would like to thank all Councillors as well as those members of the public asked to help with particular projects.

The highlights for the year can be summarised as:

- New Teen Play area installed in Lake Meadows;
- ➤ The eleventh annual Billericay in Bloom competition;
- Improved Christmas Lights along our High Street;
- ► The fourth 'Celebration of Christmas Lights';
- The third Christmas Shop Window competition;
- Official opening of the new Public Convenience:
- ► Hosting of Radio 4s' Any Questions programme;
- ▶ Cleaning of the War Memorial;
- Additional CCTV cameras installed at the railway station and Lake Meadows;
- ▶ A further publicly-supported 'Litter Pick'.

The details for each project area are described below:



The Billericay in Bloom Working Party chaired by Cllr. Moira Moore. We had Ken Crowther of BBC Essex to present the prizes to the winners at our prizegiving event held at the Canon Roche Centre in Laindon Road. Our thanks go to all our sponsors and to our long-standing professional judges who continued to be impressed with the quality of the entries from our community.

The Christmas Lights Working Party chaired by Cllr. David Knight. Many new Christmas Lights were erected this year ably supplied, erected and maintained by our new contractors. Billericay Town Council received congratulations this year on the Christmas Lights. The fourth Celebration of Christmas Lights was held on 28th November when, despite the cold, over 500 people came to see Santa Claus switch on our new decorations. The occasion was complemented by the Salvation Army Band and Billericay School choir, the Billericay Youth Town Council, Billericay Lions , Police and staff from the Chequers Public House. Thermaseal won the best decorated shop window and received their prize of £100 which they donated to a local charity, Hamelin Trust. Thank you for all those who decorated their windows and sponsored the Christmas Lights.



The Recreation Working Party chaired by Cllr. Peter Bowditch. The Town Council are working together with Basildon District Council on a programme to improve the facilities in Lake Meadows for our residents and expect an agreement in place for the new fiscal year. With the agreement of Basildon District Council we installed new play equipment at Lake Meadows Park at a cost of £86,000 of which £63,000 came from Essex County Council Community Initiatives Fund, Veolia Cleanaway Pitsea Marshes Trust and Awards for All Lottery Funding; we thank them for their support for this project.

The Crime Prevention/CCTV Working Party chaired by Cllr. Colin Dyer. In addition to the CCTV cameras installed in the High Street, additional cameras have been sited at the railway station and in Lake Meadows. All the cameras are now operational.

War Memorial – Town Councillors, with representatives of the Royal British Legion, Youth Town Council, Billericay Society and Billericay Archaeological & Historical Society, carried out a general cleaning of the memorials prior to the November Remembrance Day Parade.

Professional cleaning was undertaken to enhance the inscriptions of the World War II memorial making them easier to read. To avoid causing damage to the memorial, extensive trials were undertaken to ensure that the correct cleaning process was used.



The Litter Working Party chaired by Cllr. John Buchanan. Another successful "Big Litter Pick" was held in October 2008 with over 100 bags of rubbish collected from several different sites in the town. The Working Party installed three new litter bins (two in Stock Road and one at the Station) and supported Basildon District Council's campaign to reduce smoking related litter by distributing "butt boxes" to several businesses in the town.

The Any Questions Working Party chaired by Cllr. David Knight. Billericay Town Council hosted BBC Radio 4s' Any Questions programme on 22nd August 2008 at the Emmanuel Church, Laindon Road. Over 200 Billericay residents experienced a lively evening of audience questions answered by Carol Gould, James Delingpole, Professor Frank Furedi and Bob Crow and chaired by Jonathan Dimbleby.



Bus Shelters – The Town Council have installed two new bus shelters – one in Rosebay Avenue and the other in Arlington Way.

A new term of Billericay Youth Town Council has arrived and in November we received a new group of Councillors from Billericay and Mayflower High School. We also have two members who live in Billericay but attend schools at Chelmsford and Southend.

The appointment of positions on the Council were agreed at our first meeting when I was appointed as Chairwoman, Starr Mumford Vice-Chairwoman, Lauren Brown Treasurer and Bethan Cousins Secretary.

Since November we have been working on various projects including: MUSA (Multi User Sports Area), Talent Show, provision of activities for the Summer Holidays, etc. Recently we have even acknowledged the latest technology by having MSN meetings (these are meetings which are instant over the internet).

Furthermore, we are so anxious to learn and improve that we have been to several other Council functions where we have learnt various new ways of communication and team working skills.

Since the Annual General Meeting, we have had various members of the community attend our meetings including twice monthly representatives of the Library Service, Essex



County Council Youth Service, Police and Officers of Basildon District Council. It is very much hoped that we will be able to assist these organisations by participating in events and schemes they have planned.

We are also hoping that it may be possible to install a MUSA within Lake Meadows Park for which we will have to obtain support from Basildon District Council prior to seeking grant funding. We had also, at the request of the District Council, been considering a use for the Third Tennis Court, Lake Meadows but due to the overhanging trees and the amount of debris these cause we have not been able to reach a satisfactory conclusion.

The Youth Council also assisted members of the Town Council in choosing the playground equipment installed at Lake Meadows Park by visiting a number of play areas within Basildon District and other parts of the County and then discussing the requirements with various contractors. We are pleased to note that the equipment installed is proving very popular.

One of my first functions as Chairwoman was to lay a wreath on behalf of the BYTC at the Remembrance Day Parade and I was also able to present the cheque to the winner of the Town Council Best Christmas Shop Window Competition during December.
