TOWN COUNCIL CUTS TAX BILLS

Your Town Council has approved the Finance Committee's recommendation and cut its council tax precept for 2009/2010 by 6%, equivalent to £1 for a Band D property. This may not represent a huge amount to individuals, but it shows that Councillors understand that residents have less money in their pockets because of the current economic climate and have taken action to reduce taxpayers' burden. Several years of prudent financial management and increased outside funding will mean that services and future projects will be unaffected by this move. Every project in the pipeline has been budgeted for and reasonable reserves have been allocated for unforeseen circumstances.

BIG LITTER PICK – 11 October 2008



Well, what a turnout! Approximately fifty people from all sectors of the community assembled at Billericay Town Council offices on a bright Saturday morning to take part in yet another 'Big Litter Pick' organised by the Town Council to help make Billericay a tidier place. All participants were issued with high visibility vests, litter picking implements and hoops to keep the bags open whilst collection was in progress. The hoops were kindly donated to the Town Council with the assistance of Trevor Draper, Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce who had obtained sponsorship from Waitrose, The Raj, Greggs Bakery, Billericay Bakery, Wimpy, Fish'n'Chick'n and Deli37.

Approximately 80 bags of rubbish were collected in total from the High Street, Sun Corner, Laindon Road, Queens Park, Norsey Road, Festival Gardens, Lake Meadows and the Railway Station. Those people covering the High Street areas noticed a reduction in rubbish from previous years so perhaps the message is getting through. However, there were still plenty of cigarette ends to be found.

Members of the Norsey Wood Society also take part in the 'Big Litter Pick' and their Chairman expressed concern about the amount of dog mess prevalent along the Easy Access Trail in Norsey Wood, particularly near the car park. This is a health hazard, especially to the many young children and school parties who visit the wood. Dog owners should ensure that they clean up after their dogs.

WAR MEMORIAL

During October members of the Town Council War Memorial Working Party, comprising Town Councillors, representatives of the Royal British Legion, Youth Town Council, Billericay Society and Billericay Archaeological & Historical Society, carried out a general cleaning of the area, removed the suckers from the two lime trees and the moss from the memorials.

The work is part of the annual maintenance programme and is undertaken prior to the November Remembrance Day Parade.

Professional cleaning has now been undertaken to make the inscriptions of the World War II memorial easy to read. To avoid causing damage to the memorial extensive trials were undertaken to ensure that the correct cleaning process was used.

MORE NEW SIGNS SHOW THE WAY



Walking is good for you, but of course you don't want to get lost, and you don't want to go the long way round. Billericay has got many well used footpaths but until recently few of them carried any hint as to where they would lead you. Following the success of the first signposted walking route in early 2008, the signs have now gone up for the route from the railway station all the way to Queens Park Country Park, passing Lake Meadows on the way. Essex County Council provided the funding through the Community Initiative Fund, and on 3rd December County Councillors John Jowers and Tony Hedley joined Town Councillors John Buchanan, David Knight and Kevin Mesnard with the Town Clerk, to declare the new route open.
