




1914-2014 BILLERICAY REMEMBERS

Like many communities Billericay Town Council is taking the opportunity to mark the Centenary year of the outbreak of World War One. This event, more than any other, brought about changes across the world affecting people on so many levels. Large estates throughout the country lost most of their male workforce, women came out of their homes to help fill places men had vacated and servants who stood next to their masters in the trenches would never be able to return to the same social structure again. The centenary year gives us the opportunity to reflect on a time that shaped the history of our country.

We approached schools, societies and Churches Together to gauge the feeling of the Community and had a very good response. As a result, a working party was formed and we are pleased to announce we are coordinating a weekend of events on Saturday August 2nd, Sunday August 3rd and Monday August 4th which was the day that Great Britain entered the War. All events will be held in St. Mary Magdalen so why not pop in and view the exhibition and see the floral displays on Saturday and Sunday and stop for a cup of tea or coffee on Saturday morning. On Sunday afternoon there will be songs, a talk and contributions from the schools. There will also be a commemorative service organised by Churches Together on Monday evening. Tickets for the Sunday afternoon event will be available from the Town Council offices from 14th July. This

is a free event but due to the size of the Church, ticket allocation has to be restricted to two per applicant. If you take tickets then find you cannot use them please return them to the Town Council office so that others might benefit.



STREET PASTORS DEFIBRILLATOR UPDATE

EARLY in 2014 Billericay Street Pastors became aware that there was no Public Access Defibrillator in the High Street. They began to share this information out and about and decided to do some fund raising to secure one.


They decided to take part in John Baron MPs Fun Walk at Barleylands and this was completed. The money raised is still being collected and then a claim will be made to the organisation committee who will add to this from the central pool. With the support of Inspector Mark Rayner from Essex Police, Hazles Pottery Barns Barleylands, One Stop Shop and The Burstead Golf Club the amount raised could be as much as £3,850. This should be enough for two defibs which we hope

will be deployed in the High Street as soon as possible.

In addition to the fund raising we were happy to receive a donation of a Defibrillator from Superintendent Adrian Coombs from Operational Policing Command at Essex Police HQ. This was an unexpected bonus and will be deployed as soon as it can be agreed as to its best position.

This has been a fantastic adventure with the added blessing of seeing such great community spirit. Along with the support of Churches together in Billericay we can see that so much goodness prevails in our Town and we look forward to continuing to support all the activities that are going on in Billericay.
