(a) Outwood Common – members are advised that the surfacing defects need to be repaired professionally and are asked to consider the quotations below from Basildon Council.

(i) Option 1 – to dig back and overlay rubber Tigermulch to areas worn through, pulled apart and showing exposed concrete under all equipment, plus 3 no 600 x600 slabs laid under in front of bench where worn onto concrete base - £3,485.00 + VAT

(ii) Option 2 – to lift and repair existing matting, using new where necessary and under teen shelter area, with soil-seed as necessary - £2,390.00 + VAT

BBC has advised that Option 1 is approved as they feel it will provide a much better solution and will last far longer than Option 2.
